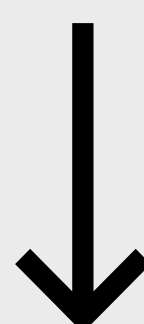




GET TO KNOW LITTLE AFRICA

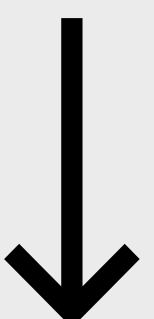


This work takes us back to the beginning of “Amefrican history” so that we never forget: we are in **Little Africa!**
